Vision Impaired Drive Day - Expression of Interest

In February 2026, Fifth Gear Motoring is excited to be hosting a Vision Impaired Drive Day. They've invited all EFLC and CBS clients to come along and participate, donating all proceeds from the day to CBS. The Drive Day will be held approx. an hour out of Canberra, in Braidwood. Due to the logistics of this event, we require an early expression of interest and confirmation of numbers. The event details are:

Location: One Raceway, 4770 Braidwood Rd, Turrumbidgee NSW (approx. 1 hr 15 min from Canberra). Please note we have chosen this location as it provides the safest driving environment for both the participants and instructors in comparison to potential venues in located closer to Canberra.

Date: One day in the first week of February 2026 (exact date confirmed once participant numbers are known)

Eligibility: Participants must be 16 or older and unable to obtain a driver's licence due to a visual impairment.

Cost: 80\$ pp

The Drive Day will give individuals with low vision the chance to get behind the wheel of a car in a safe and supportive environment. Each vehicle is equipped with dual controls, and participants drive alongside a fully accredited instructor. It's a fun and confidence-building experience, with family, friends and carers all welcome to attend.

Recipe from October Sense-able Cooking

Koftas (6)

Ingredients:

- 250g beef or lamb mince
- 250g sausage mince
- 1 onion chopped finely
- 2 garlic cloves minced
- ½ bunch parsley chopped
- 1 teaspoon of each
- Sumac, oregano, cumin and paprika
- Salt and pepper to taste

Method:

1. Place all ingredients into a bowl. Mix well.
2. Make 6 thick sausage shape rolls.
3. Place on skewers.
4. Cook on a BBQ /grill for 20 to 25 mins flip over halfway.
5. Serve in a bread wrap with salad.

Lemon drizzle cake/ muffins

Ingredients:

- 2 lemons zested and squeezed

- 1 ½ cups self-raising flour
- ¾ cup sugar
- ½ cup oil
- ½ cup milk
- 1 egg

Method:

1. Oven 180 moderate temperature.
 2. Mix dry ingredients into a bowl.
 3. Add wet ingredients except for lemon juice.
 4. Mix well.
 5. Place batter into lined cake tin.
 6. Bake 25 to 30 mins till cooked. Or muffin tin cook for 20 to 25 mins.
 7. Place lemon juice and 1/4 cup water and 1/4 cup sugar in a saucepan heat medium heat for 3 mins till sugar dissolved.
 8. Pour lemon syrup over hot cake.
